

April 27, 2019 – Faith Choi, 18 of Frederick, MD and Aneka Seumanutafa, 18 of Emmitsburg, MD

Q: Breaking this record was truly an incredible accomplishment. What are your thoughts from the day?

Choi: I could finish with par mostly when she made birdie. To be honest, it's our first time playing four-ball. We have played a lot of junior golf together; she's normally the more aggressive person

Seumanutafa: I had finals. I'm in college. This was my first time playing the course. I just flew in this morning and got my information from her, to be honest. It's pretty straightforward. I'm a long hitter so my landing area was pretty wide and I had a lot of wedges in [to the greens].

Q: Did you guys have a strategy set going into your round today?

Seumanutafa: She's usually more consistent, in the middle of the fairway and on the green, so if I have a chance to go for any of the flags, I'll go for them. I have experience at Pinehurst No. 2 from winning Junior North & South in 2017. I had a final before I came down here and I have one more before we go to regionals. We just need to keep our heads on, get our game plan going into the weekend.

Q: Have you both played together before?

Choi: We've been on a team together but not necessarily as partners.

Seumanutafa: We know each other's games, we practice together, too.

Q: How long have you both known each other?

Choi: I started playing when I was 4, met her at 13, so we've known each other 4 years.

Seumanutafa: I think she made her decision to go there on her own...

Choi: "Mostly" on my own. She was always pushing Ohio State and I was thinking about it...
