"I had two holes in a row that had mental errors... brain farts... because I just was in front of the green and making double. I was thinking what has happened. I really worked on trying to stay focused."

"I'm starting to find that I'm a better stroke play person than match play person. It used to be vice versa. I need to figure something out there."

"You just play the stroke play round to gain confidence and understand the greens. The first two days were good and today I really struggled. Maybe it was match play jitters. My opponent was a great player. She has some hiccups too. On the last three holes I really found my focus."

"It's a fabulous golf course for match play. Everything is one hundred yards in. the greens are tricky, but they're extremely fair if you putt well. I feel that the younger players do have an advantage. That is ok. I understand it. They hit it far. It's a fair course overall for match play."

"It's redemption. Last year I did not play well and was not thinking well. For some reason I didn't like the golf course. You don't ever like a golf course when you're hitting it poorly. I like this style of a course a lot better."

"I really love that the field has a younger feel to it. The mid-am is such an important tournament to me. I want younger players to play in it. I want them to play in our opens and amateurs. Their golf games are better. They learned a different way than we did but hats off to the younger girls."

"I enjoy watching the girls hit it. My opponent was hitting it 20-30 yards past me. She did that on a par-4 today. I thought wow kudos! But in the long run its about getting the ball in the hole."

"We do need the younger generation to perpetuate the rest of golf for us. I'm at the end of my career. That's cool. I just want the mid-am field to stay strong."
