Corey Weworski

Q. It was a good day. A comfortable match with a great group. You obviously had a great start.

Corey Weworski: Great start and a good group. I was really looking forward to it because I haven't played with the girls in a while and it was kind of inspiring. They don't mess up. They're really good players.

Q: Does that help you along?

Corey Weworski: Yes, that helped me along.

Q: Didn't you just win something big in California? Was your game where you wanted it to be then or is it building?

Corey Weworski: Yes, the California State Seniors. There it was really good, and then I had a torn tendon and torn ligament, and I took off for two months. I was in the rough twice today. Both times I had a chip out. One time I got up and down and the other time I got a bogey.

Q: What percent is it?

Corey Weworski: It's a 50% tear. I've done everything. Blood spinning. Stem Cell. I was hoping that I didn't need surgery, but I was talking to a rules official and she just had two surgeries and said I have to get this done, it's never going to go away. Last year I was looking at pictures I have the same thing on [brace]. It didn't hurt as much as this one. It was just tendonitis at that point. This is a real tear. So you know what the doctors tell me – stop using it. How come when athletes that play professional football they just sew it up and say get back out there. Me? Wait a whole year. That's not going to happen. I've never been to Cedar Rapids. This has been great. This is beautiful. The golf course is great.

Q: You've been there before and got that trophy. Does that matter to you this year?

Corey Weworski: Get to match play. That's always my goal. Try to play good golf and everything else will take care of itself. Even if it doesn't, that's good too.
