Bandon Dunes

Q: A good round today, how good is a 68 in these conditions? I mean, in the morning the wind wasn't blowing much, but it started to pick up.

Julia Misemer: Yeah, it was nice. It started off a little slow and then started making some putts, and so that helped a lot. Just stayed patient and stayed confident.

Q: Do you make any adjustments when the wind starts to pick up?

Julia Misemer: I try to adjust as little as possible, just stick with my game and yeah, keep consistent.

Q: Yeah, you played better on the back. 3 birdies, go through those, I think it was 13, 14, 17, is that right?

Julia Misemer: Yeah, I think so, yeah.

Q: Anything notable about any of them?

Julia Misemer: Just really focused on rolling putts straight, just trusting lines and trusting landing areas in the greens, so yeah.

Q: What were the lengths of the putts on 13 and 14 do you remember?

Julia Misemer: Pretty all over, but I think one was maybe 10 and then 3 maybe and then 15.

Q: Yeah I saw the last putt, it lipped out?

Julia Misemer: Yeah it was a little gnarly, but yeah, it's all good.



Q: It looked like you read it right, was it just too much speed?

Julia Misemer: No I mean, I still take it as it was a good and so it was still a solid way to finish.

Q: Have you had much success this summer? Has it been a summer where you, you come here and you feel like I can shoot a 68?

Julia Misemer: Yeah, yeah, I mean definitely my game is definitely getting better and better every day and so I'm feeling the progress and so I was really excited to come here.

Q: Yeah, anything specific about any part of your game that's gotten better over the last couple of weeks?

Julia Misemer: Definitely been feeling really good about the mid irons and putting this past week has really clicked and so I think mid irons are going to be important out here and controlling them and then making putts, yeah.

Q: Yeah, controlling your ball flight seems like at this course and knowing what it's going to do on the ground - I don't know how much links golf you've played but...

Julia Misemer: Not a ton but a little bit, yeah.

Q: And you have experience at the Women's Am, correct? I remember you beat the medalist a couple years ago at Chambers Bay.

Julia Misemer: Yeah, yeah I think this is my 3rd or 4th Women's Am .

Q: You played two Opens, right?

Julia Misemer: Yeah, two Opens and then a few Girls' Juniors, so...

Q: So do you feel more and more comfortable when you come to a USGA championship with all that experience in your back pocket?

Julia Misemer: I do, yeah, I know I think I did some...I was counting them and I actually think this is my 10th USGA tournament, so, I am feeling more confident every year, so yeah, just more, like hungry to win.

Q: Yeah, did you just circle Bandon Dunes, I don't know if you've ever been here before? I mean this is not a course you see in the states, I mean there's not many courses like this.

Julia Misemer: Yeah, I mean it was definitely a good motivator to get to come somewhere so special and get some really nice weather, get a break from the heat, so that's I mean that's a big bonus.
