COURSE SETUP

Portland Golf Club will be set up at 5,864 yards and will play to a par of 35-37--72. The yardage for each round of the championship will vary due to course setup and conditions.

ABOUT THE COURSE

Portland Golf Club, established in 1914, is regarded as one of the most prestigious and challenging clubs in the Pacific Northwest. The club's location was chosen due to its proximity to the Spokane, Portland and Seattle railroad lines, and its course was designed by the club's founding members. In 1964, the course underwent a significant redesign by Robert Trent Jones Sr., who is attributed as the course designer. Through decades of championship tradition, Portland's tree-lined fairways and challenging green complexes have defined the club's character.

ENTRIES

Entries open Wednesday, April 15, 2026 at 9 a.m. ET.

CHAMPIONSHIP FIELD

A starting field of 132 players will compete in the U.S. Senior Women's Amateur. Following 18-hole rounds of stroke play on Sept. 26-27, the field will be cut to the top 64 scorers for match play. Five 18-hole rounds of match play will occur from Sept. 28-30 to determine the finalists, who will square off in an 18-hole championship match on Oct. 1.

ADMISSION

Admission is free. Tickets are not required for the championship and fans are encouraged to attend.

SCHEDULE OF PLAY

Practice rounds will take place Sept. 24-25, and the championship schedule is as follows:

- Saturday, Sept. 26 (Stroke play, Round 1, 18 holes)
- Sunday, Sept. 27 (Stroke play, Round 2, 18 holes)
- Monday, Sept. 28 (Round of 64, match play)
- Tuesday, Sept. 29 (Round of 32/Round of 16, match play)
- Wednesday, Sept. 30 (Quarterfinals/Semifinals, match play)
- Thursday, Oct. 1 (Championship Match, 18 holes)

2025 CHAMPIONSHIP

Dawn Woodard, of Greenville, S.C., finally broke through and captured that elusive USGA championship with a 20-hole victory over Sue Wooster, of Australia, at the Omni Homestead Resort's Cascades Course, in Hot Springs, Va. The Furman University graduate was coming off a quarterfinal showing in the 2024 championship. This was Woodard's 35th USGA championship. Wooster suffered her fourth defeat in a U.S. Senior Women's Amateur final.

CHAMPIONSHIP HISTORY

The U.S. Senior Women's Amateur Championship debuted in 1962 for female golfers age 50 and older. By the late 1950s, several senior women's golf organizations had been formed, principally to conduct tournaments, but there was no existing event to determine the national champion. The USGA stepped in, and in January 1962, the Executive Committee approved the formation of the competition.

Senior women's golf has flourished over the years. Several major competitions have sprung up throughout the country, including the USGA's U.S. Senior Women's Open, which debuted in 2018. The Senior Women's Amateur competition went from a 54-hole, stroke-play event to its current match-play format in 1997.

USGA CHAMPIONSHIPS IN OREGON

The 64th U.S. Senior Women's Amateur will be the 42nd USGA championship held in the state of Oregon and the fourth USGA championship held at Portland Golf Club. Bandon Dunes Golf Resort has hosted the most USGA championships in Oregon with nine, including the 2025 U.S. Women's Amateur and the 2022 U.S. Junior Amateur.
