Minjee Lee Wins the 2022 Championship

When Minjee Lee first announced her presence at a USGA championship a decade ago by winning the U.S. Girls' Junior Championship, she was asked by Golf Channel reporter Steve Burkowski if more USGA titles were in the offing.

Her two-word answer: "I'm coming."

That might have sounded like bravado, but it turned out to be prophetic.

After registering an impressive four-stroke victory on Sunday at Pine Needles Lodge & Golf Club in the 77th U.S. Women's Open Championship Presented by ProMedica, the 26-year-old Australian joined a Hall-of-Fame group of players to have claimed both the U.S. Girls' Junior and U.S. Women's Open.

Lee, No. 4 in the Rolex Rankings, now shares that distinction with the likes of Mickey Wright, JoAnne Gunderson Carner, Hollis Stacy, Amy Alcott, Inbee Park and Ariya Jutanugarn.

"I mean, this is pretty special," said Lee. "This is the one I've always wanted to win since I was a little kid, so it just feels pretty amazing to be able to get it done today. I just can't believe it."

Lee might have missed out on becoming the second player in Women's Open history to post four sub-70 rounds, but an even-par 71 gave her a 72-hole total of 13-under 271, enabling her to eclipse the 72-hole scoring record of 272 shared by Juli Inkster, In Gee Chun and Annika Sorenstam, who first posted that score in successfully defending her U.S. Women's Open title at Pine Needles in 1996.

Challenging hole locations combined with firm conditions made scoring conditions the toughest of the week on Sunday, and only two players – Hyejin Choi (70) and 2019 champion Jeongeun Lee6 (69) – broke par on the Donald Ross gem. The final-round scoring average of 75.2 was $3\frac{1}{2}$ strokes higher than Saturday's Round 3 and nearly two strokes higher than either of the first two rounds.

Mina Harigae, who entered the final round three strokes back of Lee, fought through the challenging conditions to shoot a 1-over 72 and finish solo second at 9-under 275. Choi, the runner-up in 2017 as a 17-year-old amateur and now an LPGA Tour rookie, finished third at 7-under 277, one ahead of world No. 1 Jin Young Ko. World No. 3 Lydia Ko was another stroke back at 5-under 279.

"This is definitely top one or two highlights of my career," said Harigae, who is still searching for her first win on the LPGA Tour in her 13th season. "Obviously, just the prize money [\$1.08 million], but solo second in a major, and that's my best by far. Really happy with it."

Meanwhile, Lee's weekend performance at Pine Needles was reminiscent of her mentor and idol, Karrie Webb. She might not have romped to an eight-stroke victory like Webb did here in 2001, but her fight and tenacity certainly equaled that of the steely World Golf Hall of Fame inductee.

Lee started with two quick birdies but gave them back with bogeys on the par-3 fifth and par-4 seventh.

Just when things looked as if they might go south under the final-round pressure of a major championship, Lee, sporting a lime green polo with the words "Win At All Costs" on the back, answered with clutch par saves at Nos. 9 (9 feet), 11 (8 feet), 13 (13 feet) and 14 (7 feet). Each time she converted, Lee maintained a safe distance over Harigae and other potential pursuers.

For most of the second nine, Lee, who broke through for her first major title last July at the Amundi Evian Championship in France, owned a six-stroke advantage on the field. Bogeys at the par-3 16th and par-4 closing hole trimmed the deficit to its final margin of four.

"I didn't hit it that well," said Lee. "I had really good [par] saves, up-and-downs from a lot of the places, and then finishing I had a couple birdies and a couple bogeys. I think that was enough to get it done today."

When Lee sank the short bogey putt on 18, she raised her arms in celebration and hugged her caddie Jason Gilroyed, who happened to be on the bag for the 2007 champion at Pine Needles, Cristie Kerr. She also was congratulated by longtime friend and rival Lydia Ko.

"I think she played amazing," said Ko. "It's hard even if you have a comfortable lead going into the last day. It's hard because especially at the U.S. Women's Open, anything can happen. For her to be so composed ... just shows what kind of world-class player she is."

NOTABLE - The top 10 scorers and ties earned exemptions into the 78th U.S. Women's Open at Pebble Beach (Calif.) Golf Links. The biggest benefactor was qualifier Bronte Law, of England, who finished tied for sixth.

Low-amateur honors went to Louisiana State University All-American Ingrid Lindblad, of Sweden, who posted 1-under 283 for a share of 11th. This was the sixth consecutive year an amateur finished among the top 15.

Champion Minjee Lee now has eight victories as a member of the LPGA Tour. It was her second of 2022, following the Cognizant Founders Cup in New Jersey. Her 71 was the highest final-round total of any of her eight LPGA Tour victories.

Lee's younger brother, Min Woo, the 2016 U.S. Junior Amateur champion, will be teeing it up in 11 days in the 122nd U.S. Open at The Country Club in Brookline, Mass. Min Woo owns two victories on the DP World Tour.

Championship History

The U.S. Women's Open was added to the USGA's roster of championships in 1953, 58 years after the first U.S. Women's Amateur. The reason for the USGA's relatively late assumption of the Women's Open is simple: women's professional golf is fairly new. When Opal Hill turned professional in 1938, she and Helen Hicks were two of the very few women golf professionals in the world.

Unlike the other 14 national championships conducted by the USGA, the Women's Open was created by another organization. In 1946, the short-lived Women's Professional Golfers Association introduced the Women's Open at match play at the Spokane (Wash.) Country Club. The Spokane Athletic Round Table, a men's fraternal organization, contributed the \$19,700 purse from its slot machines proceeds.

The first Women's Open was the only one conducted at match play. Patty Berg won the 36-hole qualifying medal in 1946, with rounds of 72-73—145, then won the championship by defeating Betty Jameson, 5 and 4, in the 36-hole final.

The small membership of the WPGA ran the championship for three years. By 1949, however, women's professional golf was making significant strides and the Ladies Professional Golf Association was founded. A group of 11 women, including Berg, Jameson, Louise Suggs and Babe Didrikson Zaharias, established the new association to provide organized tournaments for women professionals. The LPGA ran the Women's Open for four years, but in 1953 asked the USGA to conduct the championship. The first Women's Open under the USGA flag was played at the Country Club of Rochester, in upstate New York, where Betsy Rawls won the second of her four Women's Open titles (1951, 1953, 1957, 1960).

Conducted by the USGA ever since, the Women's Open is the oldest championship open to women professionals and amateurs. Rawls and Mickey Wright, the only other four-time winner (1958, 1959, 1961, 1964) were the championship's dominant players from 1957 through 1964, winning six Women's Opens between them during those eight years. In 1967, Catherine Lacoste, daughter of French tennis player Rene Lacoste and 1927 British Ladies Amateur Champion Simone Thion de la Chaume, became the only amateur to win the Women's Open.

In its 77-year history, the U.S. Women's Open has reigned as the world's greatest women's championship, attracting steadily increasing numbers of entries and spectators. Whereas only 37 contestants played in 1953, in 1976 the field jumped to 205 players and sectional qualifying was introduced. In 2001, a then-record 980 contestants entered. A four-day attendance

record of 41,200 was set in 1979 at Brooklawn Country Club in Fairfield, Conn. At the 50th Women's Open, in 1995, that record was more than doubled at The Broadmoor Golf Club in Colorado Springs, Colo.

In recent years, the U.S. Women's Open has truly become the world arena of women's golf. Since 1990, 17 championships have been won by international players, while only three of the first 41 champions were foreign-born. The emergence of the Women's Open as a great international contest came in 1987, when England's Laura Davies prevailed in an 18-hole playoff against Japan's Ayako Okamoto and JoAnne Gunderson Carner of the United States.

Annika Sorenstam won the second of her three U.S. Women's Open championships in 1996 and set a then 72-hole scoring mark of 272 (8 under). Juli Inkster matched that 72-hole score of 272, also setting a record in relation to par at 16 under, in 1999. In Gee Chun returned an 8-under 272 in 2015 at Lancaster Country Club, where she became just the fourth player to capture the Women's Open title in her first championship appearance.

In 2002, qualifying for the Women's Open was held in two stages for the first time — 18 holes for local qualifying and 36 holes for sectional qualifying. Since 2010, there has been one stage — a 36-hole final qualifier. Additionally, in 2014, the USGA held international qualifying for the first time in championship history. Qualifying was conducted at sites in the People's Republic of China, England, Japan and the Republic of Korea.

Entries for the U.S. Women's Open also have topped the 1,000 mark every year since 2004, illustrating the global growth of women's golf.

In 2020, the U.S. Women's Open was postponed from June to December due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Final qualifying was canceled which resulted in an all-exempt field. The 156-player field competed on two courses over the opening two rounds due to less daylight in the fall.

The USGA and ProMedica, a not-for-profit integrated health and well-being organization, announced a long-term partnership in 2022 that featured presenting partner rights for the U.S. Women's Open while notably elevating the championship through a \$10 million purse. In ProMedica's first Open partnership, Minjee Lee established the 72-hole scoring record of 271 (13 under) with her four-stroke victory at Pine Needles Lodge & Golf Club.
