Q. You had a nice roll of three straight birdies for that birdies on your last hole, what did you think of the day overall?

ANNA DAVIS: It was pretty steady, just lots of pars out there today. Lots of fairways, lots of greens, just a very consistent round like yesterday.

Q. You called this course kind of a beast yesterday, was it any more or any less of a beast today?

ANNA DAVIS: There were definitely a few pin positions out there, like hole No. 9 where you don't really know where to hit it, because you know if you hit it short, it's gone, you hit it long, it's gone. So there are a lot of pins like that today where it was a little harder to attack.

Q. Who knows what will happen in the afternoon, but what would it mean to you to earn medalist honors?

ANNA DAVIS: I mean yeah, it would be cool. It would be cool to do that and then to win.

Q. As long as you follow it up.

ANNA DAVIS: Yeah, exactly. As long as you follow it up it's cool.

Q. You're moving on to match play, how comfortable are you in that format compared to stroke play?

ANNA DAVIS: I haven't played many match play events – last year I didn't play any just because I didn't play this event, I didn't play the U.S. Women's Amateur. But I don't know, I think you kind of have to have a different mindset where not every single hole matters. So, you know, you make a bogey and it's alright, you go to the next hole. So I think it's a little bit of a different mindset that you have to adapt to, but yeah, we'll see how it goes. I'm not bad at match play.

Q. Along with your mindset, do you think your strategy in terms of how you play the course is going to change at all?

ANNA DAVIS: No, not necessarily. A lot of what match play is is basing your shot on what your partner did. So I'd say I'd probably play about the same, it just kind of depends on the pin, whether I'd attack or not.
