ANDOVER, Kan. (July 12, 2017) – The United States Golf Association (USGA) today announced tee times for the first two rounds of the 70th U.S. Junior Amateur Championship, Monday (July 17) and Tuesday (July 18), at 7,049-yard, par-71 Flint Hills National Golf Club.

The U.S. Junior Amateur consists of 18 holes of stroke play on July 17 and 18 holes of stroke play on July 18, after which the 156-player field will be reduced to the low 64 scorers. There will be six rounds of match play at Flint Hills National Golf Club, starting July 19. The quarterfinals and semifinals are slated for Friday, July 21. The championship is scheduled to conclude with a 36-hole final on Saturday, July 22, starting at 7 a.m. CDT.
